NOTE FROM LAWSON - IT'S STILL EASTER!

We're still celebrating life, death and resurrection. It's still the season of celebrating baptisms and confirmations and first communions for new adult Catholics. We're still remembering the effects of our own baptism and renewing our baptismal promises. Water is usually everywhere!

The Alpha and Omega—the infinite beginning and all there is—has risen from the dead! Alleluia! Through the waters of baptism, we have been born again, born into the family of God! The Paschal candle is lit throughout the Easter season, light has overcome darkness, Jesus is here. It was lit at our baptism. It will be lit at our funeral to proclaim Christ's victory over death.

In the Rite of Acceptance Into the Order of Catechumens, adults who have not been baptized begin their journey the same way infants do. They give their name. We are *all* named. We are not anonymous, God calls us by name! He knows us! Next, for an infant, parents answer the question, "What do you ask of God's Church?" Adults answers for themselves. There are lots of appropriate answers— sometimes faith, or eternal life, or relationship with God, or communion.

An infant is marked with the sign of the cross by the priest, the parents and godparents. A tiny baby, helpless, marked with a cross and all it means. An adult is also marked with the cross by the priest and the sponsor, but the adult receives that cross literally, physically nine times, very specifically and it is worth thinking about as we recall our own baptisms. Whether infant or adult, the intent is the same. These are the powerful words of the signing with the cross for adults:

Receive the sign of the cross on your forehead. It is Christ himself who now strengthens you with this sign of his love. Learn to know and follow him. Receive the sign of the cross on your ears, that you may hear the voice of the Lord. Receive the sign of the cross on your eyes, that you may see the glory of God. Receive the sign of the cross on your lips, that you may respond to the word of God. Receive the sign of the cross over your heart, that Christ may dwell there by faith. Receive the sign of the cross on your shoulders, that you may bear the gentle yoke of Christ. Receive the sign of the cross on your hands, that Christ may be made known in the work that you do. Receive the sign of the cross on your feet, that you

may walk in the way of Christ. Then, finally, over the whole person, the priest says, "I sign you with the sign of eternal life in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." Catechumens: Amen. And all of us: Amen.
