NOTE FROM LAWSON – IT'S FATHER'S DAY!

I wonder what that means to you? In my years working with people, I find it's a mixed bag depending on your experience. My father died over fifty years ago, so I didn't get to know him as I became an adult. I'll have questions in heaven! Others have their fathers for a long, long time. Some fathers are better at it than others. Some are missing all together. Some are at home but not really present. Some are loving. Some are cruel. Our experiences of our fathers often impact our understanding of God. It can get complicated when Jesus invites us to be part of the family by saying, "Our Father". That term might be endearing, which is such a blessing. It might be off-putting or more formal than it's meant to be. I wonder how you feel.

The Gospels tell us over and over that God is good. He is the good Father, the merciful, patient, generous Father. He can correct with firmness, but without humiliating. He is happy to be our Father! If yours wasn't so great, it might help to remember that any earthly father is supposed to be like God, God isn't the imitator. He's the example, better than the best.

In February, 2015, in his General Audiences, Pope Francis did a series of talks on the family. He devoted two of them to fathers. I love his words - "The first need, then, is precisely this: that a father be *present* in the family. That he be close to his wife, to share everything, joy and sorrow, hope and hardship. And that he be close to his children as they grow: when they play and when they strive, when they are carefree and when they are distressed, when

they are talkative and when they are silent, when they are daring and when they are afraid, when they take a wrong step and when they find their path again...A good father *knows how to wait and knows how to forgive from the depths of his heart*...children need to find a father waiting for them when they come home after failing. They will do everything not to admit it, not to show it, but they need it; and not to find it opens wounds that are difficult to heal.”

Pope Francis has talked about wounds we carry. He said, “I see clearly the thing the church needs most today is the ability to heal wounds and to warm the hearts of the faithful.” I want that. Lord, help us to be healers and warmers! We have an especially excellent helper during this Year of St. Joseph! There is a cool prayer card of him with Jesus as a teenager for you. I love this part of the prayer,” with you Christ became a man.” Please get one! Happy Good Father’s Day.
